Daniel is excited to help the students who are following in his footsteps.

The Take Stock in Children (TSIC) program is a scholarship and mentoring program that helps increase high school graduation rates by holding students to a pledge to stay out of trouble, earn good grades and meet with a mentor on a regular basis. All students enrolled in TSIC are partnered with a volunteer mentor who meets with his or her student to provide support, guidance, accountability and friendship. Upon successful graduation from the program and high school, students are awarded a full-tuition scholarship to a four-year state college, two-year community college, or a vocational/technical school, depending on their career path.

Immokalee Readers

The **Immokalee Readers** is an after-school early intervention literacy tutoring program designed to target the lowest performing student readers and complement the reading instruction they receive during their regular school day. The program has expanded to include **ALL five elementary schools** in Immokalee.

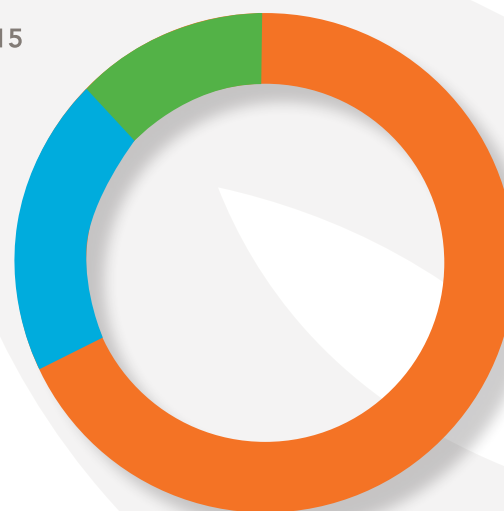
